This course is suitable for anyone who has completed the Beginners class or those who have had previous experience in watercolours. We will focus on improving on different ways of applying paint, uses of brush strokes and techniques, along with colour mixing and composition. We will also refer to genre and critical references to support individual development. Examples, demonstrations and exercises will introduce each topic and individual support will be given each week.

Please do bring any watercolour materials which you already have, although some watercolour paints will be available to borrow.

Paper is available to purchase in the art room.

The tutor will provide some materials to borrow for the first session and advice will be given, if required, for purchasing your own. If you do this before the course, make sure you have a range of brushes and some quality paints.
